

Scene 1: Miller

Speaker 1: *(talking to Speaker 2 who is typing on a cell phone)* Hey, what are you doing?

Speaker 2: I'm typing out my Christmas list!

Speaker 3: Awesome! Let's get a pen and paper so we can write a letter to Santa!

Speaker 2: A letter?! I'm just going to copy and paste it into an email!

Speaker 4: Yeah, that pen and paper style is so last year! I recorded a Youtube video with my Christmas list!

Speaker 3: Wow, maybe I need to rethink how I'm writing my list...what if Santa doesn't even check the mail anymore?!

Speaker 5: There's a cool new hotline that will take us directly to the man himself! Let's give him a call! *(uses Speaker 2's cell phone to call)*

Play phone call narration, Track 1

Scene 2: Abbott

(Super Mom is being overworked and stretched to her limits with all of their responsibilities, She tries to maintain, but she's about to snap!)

Speaker 1: Mom, have you seen my red sweater?

Speaker 2: Mom, did you pack my lunch for the field trip today?

Mom: Yes, it's already in the refrigerator.

Speaker 3: Mom, I need a costume for the Christmas Play.

Mom: Yes, dear.

Speaker 5: Mom, I told my teacher that you would chaperone the trip to the Capitol with my whole class.

Mom: Yes, dear.

Dad: Don't forget the PTO meeting tonight!

(Everyone all starts talking at once)

Mom: Ahhhh!!!!!!

(Mom starts typing on her cell phone)

Mom: Dear Santa, I'm keeping this short because I don't have much time. If you're reading your emails while you're on the road or in the sky, I hope you'll notice mine. I'm sending you a link to some travel sites I know. We need a vacation and we need it bad! Dear Santa! We've got to get away!

Scene 3: Shutes

Speaker 1: Hey, Joey. What's up?

Joey: Well, I'm trying to get Santa's attention by getting as many friends as possible on Facebook.

Speaker 2: I'm not sure Santa is too impressed by that kind of thing.

Joey: Well, I've also been writing back and forth to a couple of elves on Elf Chat, trying to make sure that Santa gets my Christmas list in time for Christmas.

Speaker 3: Elf Chat?

Joey: Yeah, it's a new service they offer on the North Pole website, but I don't get it.

Speaker 1: What do you mean?

Joey: Well, I keep sending in my list and all they do is send me a link to one website.

Speaker 2: What website is it?

Joey: *(reading slowly)* It's called the A-S-P-C-A!

Speaker 3: ASPCA! Well, what did you ask for?

Scene 4: Palmer

Grandma: Well, that was a real nice walk in the mall, Grandpa Fred.

Grandpa: Yeah, Grandma Eunice, really got my heart rate going.

Grandma: Me too! But I'm tired of walking around in circles at the mall, it's so boring!

Grandpa: *(gets an idea)* I know! Let's ask Santa to bring one of those new Dance Revolution machines we saw in the arcade!

Grandma: That's a great idea! Oh...but it's too late to send a letter to Santa now. It's only a few days until Christmas. Our letter will never get there.

Speaker 1: Hey Grandma and Grandpa! What if you FaceTime Santa Claus, like you do with us grandkids?

Speaker 2: What a great idea! But I don't know if Santa will answer...he's pretty busy right now!

Speaker 3: We'll never get Santa himself, but Mrs. Claus is always online these days. I think she's addicted to her phone.

Grandma: Come on, let's give it a try!

(Grandma and Grandpa hold up their phone with the grandkids in the background, pretending to FaceTime - CUE FACETIME SOUND EFFECT)

Mrs. Claus: Hello! Mrs. Claus here! Can you see me?!

Grandma: Yes, Mrs. Claus, we can see you! You look great!

Mrs. Claus: Oh, I don't know, they say these screens add twenty pounds!

Grandpa: Oh, Mrs. Claus, don't be ridiculous! You look great!

Mrs. Claus: Oh, Grandpa Fred, how nice of you to say so! What can I do for you? There's still room in Santa's sleigh for a Cadillac or a snowmobile, if you want one!

Grandma: Oh no, Mrs. Claus. We don't need anything like that! We want one of those new fangled dance revolution machines we saw those young people jumping around on.

Grandpa: You know, the kind where the music plays and you make your feet do the moves...like this! (does a funny dance) We've heard it's great exercise!

Mrs. Claus: (*laughing*) You two crack me up! Well if a dance revolution is what you want under your Christmas tree, rest assured, you can count on me!

Grandma: We knew we could, Mrs. C!!

Scene 5: Rotzien

Speaker 2: You're writing him a letter? You mean, like with pen and paper?

Speaker 3: How quaint. You know Skyping would be a lot faster.

Speaker 4: But things like Elf Chat, Facebook and email make it so much easier!

Molly: Oh, don't get me wrong. I think all of those wonderful new gadgets are fantastic. But I think Christmas ought to be a time when we all slow down, instead of speed up...look around us and celebrate the wonderful things in our lives.

Speaker 1: You mean like family and friends?

I know I can count on you. It's me, Molly.

With shopping and parties, we rush in and out. I'm worried we forget what the season's all about.

Scene 6: Glomski

(Santa enters)

Speaker 1: It's Santa!!

Speaker 3: Yeah, have you gotten all of the texts and emails we've sent you?!
